NAC 656.210 Required hours; means to obtain certain credits; applicability of credit. ([NRS 656.130](#), [656.200](#))

- 1. Each court reporter shall, every 2 years, complete at least 15 hours of continuing education relating to the practice of court reporting, at least two of which must include a review of the statutes, regulations and court rules governing the practice of court reporting in this State.*
- 2. The Board will provide each court reporter with the means to obtain these two credits other than by personal attendance.*
- 3. Credit for continuing education may not be carried forward for any year.*
